



UNT SYSTEM CELEBRATES BLACK HISTORY MONTH

February is Black History Month, a celebration of Black individuals who -- through courage, excellence and determination to break down racial and ethnic barriers -- have made significant contributions in civil rights, politics, science, the arts, our communities and other areas over the course of history. UNT World is proud to present throughout the month our "Did You Know?: Black History Month Facts" series and "Black History Month: Excellence in Our Community" video series. DID YOU KNOW?: The heart of Denton's music scene resides at UNT's College of Music and its original jazz studies program, but its soul was nourished by the <u>city's many homegrown Black musicians</u>. Few know that <u>Sylvester Stewart</u> of Sly and the Family Stone was born in Denton in 1943. Saxophonist <u>Herschel Evans</u> was born in Denton in 1909 and is credited for pioneering a Texas Tenor Sax lineage that still swings today. And before Denton's beloved <u>Fred Moore</u> turned to education for his vocation, he was a bandleader in the early 1900s, having organized a 14-piece band that got people swaying all over the county, *even* playing at white people's dances.


